THE SCARECROWS ARE BACK!





VOLUNTEERS TRANSFORM DEAD EYE POND

Dead Eye Pond was previously owned by Mr & Mrs James
Throup who gave it to North Yorkshire County Council, by deed
of gift, on 24 May 1989. The land was then bought by Cononley
PC for a nominal sum in 2001. Since then, efforts have been
made to make the area more accessible and improve it as an
area for flora and fauna to flourish, however over the last two
years, the PC and local volunteers have put in a lot of time and
energy to develop the area and finally make it accessible to
residents again.

A steering committee was set up and plans developed in conjunction with many experts in and outside the village. Specialists from the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, The National Trust, Environment Agency and the Wild Trout Trust have been engaged to formulate a plan for Dead Eye for both short- and long-term improvements.



In December 2020 a group of hardy volunteers removed overgrown vegetation which reopened the official access path. Following this, a further group of

volunteers planted over 300 trees in Spring 2021. In the autumn, more vegetation clearance was undertaken to allow a contractor to fence off the area in October 2021. In line with

expert recommendations, the area is now segregated from farm animals and almost ready for opening up to members of the public. Public access to Dead Eye is only from Ings Lane (which is a continuation of Shady Lane) via the



PC access route which is now named Throup's Track. The PC wanted to acknowledge their kind donation from the family in 1989. Further work is planned in early 2022 before an official opening in the spring. If you would like to help, please email friendsofdeadeye@gmail.com. To attract more wildlife and improve the health of the nature reserve, future jobs include more tree planting in the hedge along the access path, dredging work, monitoring natural vegetation, and creating a planting plan. The installation of a dipping platform and a viewing area will enable the public to make the most of and enjoy this valuable nature reserve, although dogs are strictly not allowed.

Huge thanks go to Dan Timbers and Mike Latham who have worked tirelessly to research, plan and coordinate these improvements for the benefit of our community, local environment, and wildlife.

LOCAL ELECTIONS 5TH MAY 2022

Elections for the new North Yorkshire Council are on 5th May. The new district is called Aire Valley and consists of Cononley, Bradley, Farnhill, Kildwick, Lothersdale and Cowling. It will carry responsibility for a wide brief including education, planning, social care, roads, bins, and local economic development. Craven District Council will disappear in May 2023 and the person you elect will represent this area for 5 years. At the time of writing the full range of candidates is not yet known. Cononley resident Andy Brown has been District Councillor for the past five years and has indicated that he intends to stand.

CONONLEY SPEED WATCH



Now in its fifth year and with over 20 volunteers, weekly deployments were resumed in January. Compared with previous years, there were fewer deployments during 2020 and 2021 due to covid, but it is hoped these will get back on track in 2022. Despite this, our volunteers monitored an

impressive 4,874 vehicles during 2021, 5.4% of which were travelling above the speed limit. There are over 80 Community Speed Watch groups across North Yorkshire. As a proportion of the total speed watch offences logged by North Yorkshire Police, Cononley has a high repeat rate. We aim to act as a deterrent and to reinforce the village speed limits. Lower speeds mean safer roads, less air pollution, and less noise pollution, helping to encourage more walking and cycling. Recent deployments indicate that the gateway on Cononley Lane is effective at lowering speeds into the village, however we are in discussion with the PC about raising funds to purchase an additional Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS). The VAS on Crosshills Road has proved to be effective at keeping average speed levels to just over 20mph, however over 70% of drivers travel above 20mph, with the highest speed of 68mph recorded at 12 noon in July 2021.
