#### CHECK YOUR HOME FOR HEAT LOSS

Now you can locate draughts and check where your house is losing heat by using the thermal imaging cameras that are free to borrow from the Institute. So far, 30 people have used the cameras and discovered some interesting results! To borrow one, email



**cononleycamera@gmail.com**. They can be fitted to an Apple or Android phone. As they work best when there is a 10-degree temperature difference between the inside and outside of a house, we will pause the scheme after Easter (unless it remains exceptionally cold) and restart in autumn. #### A WARM FUTURE FOR THE INSTITUTE



Following a detailed assessment last year, the Institute committee has developed a long-term plan to improve the building's insulation, thermal efficiency, lower energy bills and reduce

its carbon emissions. To enable the work to be carried out, a grant application has been submitted to North Yorkshire Council's Shared Prosperity Fund. If successful, the funding will pay for new double/triple glazed windows with thermal blinds in the main hall, insulation for the clock tower & fire door, floor insulation, new LED lighting and installation of solar panels. We hope to hear about the grant soon and plan to schedule most of the works during the summer holidays.

# History Corner Fatal Accident

An inquest was held on Friday at the New Inn, Cononley, on the body of Mr John Duxbury, of the firm of Duxbury & Horsfall, corn millers, Keighley. The deceased gentleman, who was highly respected, was riding along the road on horseback Thursday afternoon, and when galloping across a newly repaired part of the road his horse stumbled and he fell to the ground. Life was extinct nearly at once. Verdict, Accidental death.

# Yorkshire Post and Leeds Intelligencer Monday 7th October 1867

Further news articles reveal that Mr Duxbury bad earlier visited the New Inn with two colleagues, but had departed ahead of them as he had another matter to attend to before leaving Cononley. He had fallen on the way to Sutton, just after Club Row (also known as Frying Pan Row), where repairs to the road had caused loose stones.

A witness had stated that the horse's saddle had slipped underneath its belly, causing him to fall. Mr Duxbury was aged just 23.

### **CONONLEY WILDLIFE GROUP**

Spring is almost here, and the Pinfold is bursting into life; the snowdrops are out, and the birds are singing. There are good numbers of curlew around the



river and soon they will be seeking nest sites both in the fields along the river and on higher ground. Listen for their bubbling calls and try not to disturb them. Another bird which appears to



be on the increase in our area is the Tree Sparrow, a rarer cousin of the more common House Sparrow. They have been seen along Shady Lane, Netherghyll Lane and the allotments. Easily distinguished by the spot on their cheek and

With Spring approaching, the site has emerged from the floods


